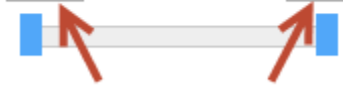

Abstract:  Background **Patient education** programmes for a range of chronic conditions are widely implemented, but studies have shown that not all participants benefit equally from the **patient education** programmes. Aim To explore differences in how persons with **diabetes experience diabetes**-related **patient education** programmes. Methods Qualitative in-depth interviews were conducted with eleven participants 6 months after participation in **patient education**. Using thematic analysis, we identified three themes: programme elements, interactions between participants and the role of facilitators. We

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


