

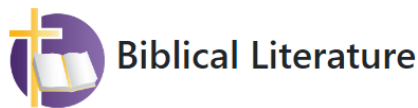
Using Anchor Bible Commentary

Navigation

Step 1: Head to the library website, library.olivet.edu. Under the Subject Guides tab, click on biblical literature.

Step 2: Look under the heading 'Selected eBooks, then click on Anchor Yale Bible Commentary.

Step 2: There are a variety of ways to access the content. You can search by key word, jump to a known page number, or navigate using the table of contents.
