
Using Google Scholar

Step 1: Type a topic into the Google Scholar search bar. Click the search button.



Note: Searches with a great number of results will need to be refined.

Step 2: Click the "hamburger" menu in the top left of the page, scroll down, and click Advanced Search.




Step 3: Add quotations around phrases in the search bar titled with all the words to create a Phrase Search.



Step 4: In the third search box titled with at least one of the words, add the words "research method study."



Step 5: Limit the date range using the box towards the bottom of the advanced search titled *return articles* dated between.




Step 6: Click the blue search button in the upper right corner.

Step 7: Scroll through the articles and read it's abstract in order to check for relevancy.

Note: Words like "study," or discussions about participants in the study, indicate the article to be a research report.

Accessing Fulltext

Step 1: Click the link on the right-hand side of any search result to get full text for a specific article.



Note: If there is no link to the side of a search result, follow Steps 2-4 below.

Step 2 (optional): Click the double arrow below the article title.

Locating Citations

Step 1: Click the quotes icon underneath any article. The citation for the article will appear in multiple formats such as MLA, APA, and more.
